COVID-19 AWARENESS PROGRAMME



COVID-19 AWARENESS PROGRAMME:

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus. Most people infected with the COVID-19 virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness. Fever, tiredness, dry cough, headache and body pain, running nose, sore throat, and diarrhea are the most common symptoms of COVID 19. The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes. Older people and those with underlying medical problems like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease, and cancer are more likely to develop serious illnesses. The best way to prevent and slow down transmission is to be well informed about the COVID-19 virus, the disease it causes \$\mathscr{C}\$ how it spreads, and preventive measures of the disease.

In Rajasthan, the first case of COVID 19 was identified in March 2020, and till date, as of 19 Feb. 2021, around 3.19 lakhs cases and 2781deaths have been reported for the same disease. Similarly, 2644 cases of COVID 19 have been reported in district Baran, and out of the total cases, 70 deaths occurred so far in the district.

To prevent and slow down the spread of disease, Pragati Sansthan with the support of the district administration and department of medical and health is organizing various awareness activities in district Baran. People are getting aware of social distancing, hand washing, or using an alcohol-based rub frequently and mask-wearing & not touching face frequently.





Activities carried out by Pragati Sansthan are as followed:-

- 1. Awareness about maintaining law & order: Meanwhile Covid time complete lockdown was imposed from March 21' to May 21', night curfews were are imposed in many states in the month of June- July 21'. Members of the organization attempted to deliberate the importance of lockdown to the locals and tried to tell them that this act of government is for their benefit only. Locals were asked to move out from home only in emergency situations.
- **2.** Food distribution: The members of the organization successfully distributed 5000 packets of food among poor and needy people during the lockdown period in the slum & rural areas of district Baran.

3. Awareness Activities:

a.Rath Yatra: In collaboration with the Department of Medical and Health Services, the organization planned this Rath yatra. Hoardings and Banners were hanged on a van and it was converted into a Rath, micks were installed and awareness was spread regarding social distancing, Hand sanitizing, wearing masks through loud systems for the locals. The do's and Donot's were also discussed with respect to precautions from Covid.

b.Rally, Banners, and pamphlet: Important information was disseminated through Banners and pamphlets. Rallies were also taken out to motivate the people and ensure complete awareness of covid.

- **4.** Distribution of Mask and sanitizer: With the help of a Self-help group 5000 masks were prepared and were distributed. 1000 liters sanitizer was also distributed to needy people of Baran.
- **5.** Spray of Sanitizer: To maintain sanitation, sanitizers were sprayed in rural and urban areas of district Baran.

INDIRA RASOI YOJANA



Indira Rasoi Yojana:

Indira Rasoi Yojana is an initiative of the Government of Rajasthan. The main objective of this scheme is to provide low-cost food to poor and needy peoples. Each plate of food will be priced at Rs 20, the state government will grant a subsidy of Rs 12 per plate with an estimated expenditure of Rs 100 crore every year. The scheme is rolled out in 213 urban local areas of Rajasthan with expected 1.5 lakh beneficiaries per year.

From August 2020, Pragati Sansthan, with the support of Zila Parishad, Baran, is running Indira Rasoi Yojana at district headquarter Baran and block headquarters Ataru of district Baran.

As per the guideline of the scheme, Pragati Sansthan is providing pure and nutritious food at Rs. 8 per plate to all people who come for lunch and dinner at Indira Rasaoi. The food served at Indira Rasoi has a pulse, vegetable, Chapati, rice, papad, and pickles or as decided by the district authority. Food in the kitchen is always prepared with pure and qualitative ingredients by trained staff. Hygenic conditions; both in the kitchen as well as a service area, are also maintained by staff. Regular supervision of kitchen' activities is done by senior staff of the organization. District administration; Zila Parishad, CMHO office, etc. also monitored the activities of Indira Rasoi from time to time.

With this scheme, around 300 persons, mainly people leaving in slums and population migrated from rural areas to urban areas such as railway station bus stand, hospitals, laborer are getting benefits daily.

Presently the organization is running Indira Rasoi at Nagar Parishad Dharmshala Staton Road, in Baran, and in Ataru. The timing of food served, at the both Rasoi (kitchen), is from o8: 30 am to 09:00 pm.

JANANI SURAKSHA YOJANA



Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY):

Janani Suraksha Yojana is a safe motherhood intervention under the National Rural Health Mission (NHM). It is being implemented with the objective of reducing maternal and infant mortality by promoting institutional delivery among pregnant women. Under this scheme, there are many provisions for pregnant women including delivery and post-delivery institutional care, cash assistant, transport facility, etc.

In district Baran, the department of medical & health and district administration identified and selected one of our self-help groups (SHG) namely Jagrati Women Group for providing food to pregnant women admitted at the district hospital, Baran. Under this scheme of food availability, breakfast, lunch, dinner, and 2-time tea with snakes are provided to each admitted pregnant woman. Foods are prepared with guidelines and instructions of hospital administration. Daliya, khichadi, chapati vegetables, fruits, milk. etc are included in food items.

Pragati's role in this food availability components of JSY scheme:

- Capacity building of SHG members on food preparation; maintain nutrient contents in food, service, record keeping, etc.
- Supervision and monitoring of food preparation.
- Create awareness of the JSY scheme with a special focus on the food availability component.
- Coordination with SHG, hospital administration, and other district administration.

Role of Jagrati SHG:

- Prepare pure and nutritious food with pure and qualitative ingredients.
- Maintain hygienic conditions in the kitchen area; prepare food with a clean hand, on a clean surface, and in clean utensils).
- Serve fresh & hot meals in clean utensils and with decent manners & respect to all admitted pregnant women.
- \bullet Ensure timely availability of food to all pregnant & lactate women.
- Progress sharing and timely reporting to the district administration.
- Around 300 pregnant women per month are getting benefits of this scheme happily.

OLD AGE HOME



OLD AGE HOME:

Pragati Sansthan has initiated various programs for benefiting old ages. Since 2013, in order to help the elderly and disabled persons, the organization with the support of the Department of Social and Justice, is managing and operating an Old Age Home at block Mangrol in district Baran. This has helped around 25 helpless elderly people by providing them with shelter, food, clothes, and other necessary amenities such as blankets, warm hats, shoes, socks, and other daily usable items. The organization is also working to provide travel passes, pension facilities, medical facilities to these people.

To felicitate enthusiasm and zest in aged adults many festivals and recreation events like Deepawali, Holi, Independent day, Republic day, etc are also celebrated and organized at home for these old ages and all people participate in these events happily. On these occasions, many organizations and individuals distributed sweets, fruits, and other gifts like clothes, spectacles, sticks, umbrellas, etc.

Every year with the help of the Rotary Club, Baran, October 1st, International Day of Older Persons is celebrated at the home for the members of the Old Age Home. On this occasion, culture programs and meetings were organized at home and many facilities were provided to elders.

Similar to this, every year with the support of the department of social and justice "Social Welfare Week" is also celebrated by Pragati Sansthan in district Bara. This year it was held at our old age home in which International Old Aged People Day is also celebrated by distributing books, watches, masks, etc. also helping them in procuring their pension in case they were not able to get it o time due to some issues.

In outreach services for older persons, Pragati Sansthan also organized various camps in which facilities like travel passes, medical services, pension services, etc provided to them free of cost.

Keeping in mind the vulnerability of elders in the current Covid 19 pandemic situation, Pragati Sansthan is adhering to all the safety and hygiene measures at home as well as in the field activities like wearing face masks, regular washing & sanitization of hands, and maintaining social distancing norms at all times, to ensure their safety & protection.





CHILD LABOUR
SCHOOL,
MANGROL, BARAN



Child Labour School, Mangrol, Baran:

Child labour school is a welfare scheme of the Ministry of Labour and Welfare, Government of India. The Scheme seeks to adopt a sequential approach with a focus on the rehabilitation of children working in hazardous occupations & processes in the first instance. Under the Scheme, a survey of child labour engaged in hazardous occupations & processes has been conducted. The identified children are to be withdrawn from these occupations & processes and then put into special schools in order to enable them to be mainstreamed into the formal schooling system. Project Societies at the district level are fully funded for the opening up special schools/Rehabilitation Centres for the rehabilitation of child labour. The special schools/Rehabilitation Centres provide- Non-formal/bridge education skilled/vocational training, Mid Day Meal Stipend @ Rs.150/- per child per month and health care facilities through a doctor appointed for a group of 20 schools.

In the year 2019, Pragati Sansthan, through a rigours survey, identified 25 children, aged 6 to 9years, who were engaged in hazardous occupation and process like hotel & Dhaba, small scale industrial work, etc. from Sahariya Basti of Mangrol town of district Baran.

To withdraw from hazardous work and educate them, a residential school, with the support of the Office of the Child Labour Project, Baran, Ministry of Labour and Welfare, GoI, was set-up in Sahariya basti and based on the prior education they were admitted in class 3–5 to enable them to be mainstreamed into formal schooling system where they studied from November 2019 to March 2020.

Besides education, food, medical and other facilities, a stipend was also provided to each of them. Later they were sent to a government school for their further study.

BETI BACHAO,
BETI PADHAO



Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao:

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao is a central government scheme that is beneficial across the country for the girl child. The primary goal of this scheme is to save the girl child from societal issues like gender-based abortions and advance girl child education across the country. This scheme was originally aimed at districts that were known as having a low sex ratio and later extended to cover other areas of the country. This is mainly an initiative based on education to help improve social perceptions and does not require the immediate transfer of cash.

Pragati Sansthan works extensively for the welfare of girl child in district Baran with the following objectives:

- Preventing selective gender-based abortion,
- Ensuring girls child survival and security in infancy,
- Ensuring girl child schooling and participation,
- Challenging gender norms and fostering gender equality,
- Giving girls a healthy and secure environment,
- Supporting the right of girls to inherit property.

Under Bati Bachao - Beti Bachao Campaign"Girl Child Week Programme" of the Department of Women and Child Development, the organization conducted various activities. The main objective of this campaign was to support underprivileged girl children to get adequate education and health care. Further, this campaign was a form of awareness drive for the locals of the area. Under this campaign 18 villages of a block, Baran was covered for following campaign activities.


Activities are undertaken:

- 1.District Level Workshop: under the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao campaign Pragati Sansthan with the support of the department of women empowerment organized a workshop at the district headquarter. In this workshop, Shri ... told about the importance of this campaign as well as the importance of the girl child education. Mr. Lalit Vaishnava of Pragati Sansthan also told about female foeticide and gender equality. Under the guidance of resource persons 'Group work' on different topics was also carried out by participants. A total of 36 participants attained this workshop. At the last Shri Bharat Kumar give a vote of thanks to resource persons as well as to participants.
- **2.**Chaupal Meeting: To create awareness about the campaign Chaupal Meetings were also organized at the village level. Total 18 villages of block Baran and Anta were covered and in each village one meeting was organized. Topics like female foeticide, gender equality, the importance of girl child education, etc were discussed in these meetings. Around 40 –50 participants including Anganwadi Workers, Sahayika, Asha health workers, Panchayat members, and villagers both male-female attained the chaupal meeting. A total of 845 persons was benefited through these Chaupal Meetings.
- **3.**School Programme: to create awareness about campaign among school children especially girls, some activities like drawing competition, slogan writing, quiz, debates related to girl education, girl health, sex ratio, female foeticide, dowry was also organized in 18 selected village. Prizes were also distributed to winners.
- **4.**Rallies were taken out in many villages and the locals were informed about the importance of a girl child's future.
- **5.**Banners and pamphlets were prepared and information was disseminated through this program. This program came out to be a huge success for the organization and a total of 1500 women and girls were beneficiaries of this scheme.





LEGAL AID AWARENESS
WORKSHOP



Legal Aid Awareness Campaign:

In the year 2014, to enlighten the legal knowledge of people of district Baran, an awareness drive-cum-programme has been initiated by the organization in block Bran and Mangrol of the district. This drive aimed to disseminate information related to the legal rights of citizens to the locals of the Baran district.


Several workshops, group meetings, and other IEC activities were carried out in both the blocks; Baran and Mangrole. Several provisions from the Indian Penal Code, Criminal Procedure Code, and various other relevant laws were taught to the people. Women were enlightened with domestic violence rules and Pre Conception- Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act. They were also taught about the right to equal pays, the right to education, and equality before the law. A sense of motivation was attempted to strive in them so that they can work efficiently in society. All the information was presented through posters, Pamphlets, hand notes, and blackboards.

In block Baran 800 people, and in Mangrole 1200 people were given legal assistance through the organization.

Such drives or campaigns help the locals to grow personally and be more confident in society while dealing with fellow beings.

Such pro bono drives are a part of the agenda of the organization.

YOJANA



JAL SWAVLAMBA YOJANA

Jal Swalamban Yojana was launched in 2016 by the Government of Rajasthan with the following key objectives:

- To create a water sustainable area
- To increase the irrigated area. To ensure effective water conservation through the convergence of resources of different departments.
- To create awareness about community participation in water management.
- To prepare a village action plan through water budgeting via community participation.
- To make the district self-sufficient unit in drinking water through sustainable measures.

The scope of this scheme is to benefit 21000 villages with around 300 priority villages with water supply by 2020.

In the year 2017, under Jal-Swalamban Yojana, Pragati Sansthan with the support of Zila Parishad, Baran created awareness about the scheme in all the seven blocks of district Baran. For this purpose, seven modified Rath on Jeeps with the sound system were prepared and Rath Yatra was carried out in 100 Gram-Panchayat of all the seven blocks of district Baran. Peoples of these villages get aware of water conservation, safe drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene, etc. Total of 4100 persons were get benefited through this campaign. BEAUTY PARLOUR
TRAINING
SKILL DEVELOPMENT




We here at Pragati Sansthan works for women empowerment as well. To achieve the same some skills training are given to young girls and women. Such programs aim to make women financially independent by inculcating certain skills which shall bring money.

In the Year 2017, Pragati Sansthan with the support of Nehru Youth Kendra, Baran conducted a three-month-long beauty parlor training at village Fatehpur of block Baran. The objective of this training was to empower women by providing the necessary skills to be a qualified beautification which ultimately helps them to stand on their own feet.

In this training, participants were trained for facial massage, hair structure, shampooing - deep conditioning, head massage, temporary removal of superfluous hair, eyebrow shaping, bleaching, basic pedicure and manicure, thermal hair styling, hair-cut, electrology, chemical jobs, make-up techniques, saree and dupatta draping, nail art and salon management including banking and accounting work. Some basics of soft skills like communication, marketing, were also taught to them.

Total 30 girls from low economic backgrounds attained and benefited from this training. Later some of them started their own parlor and some associated with other beauty parlors of the nearby areas.

NAVJEEVAN YOJANA



NavJeevan Yojana:

Nav Jeevan Yojana is an initiation of the department of social justice, Government of Rajasthan. In this scheme peoples who are involved in boot lagging and sailing other intoxicants are identified through surveys and provided skills training for their livelihoods.

In years 2019–20, under Nav Jeevan Yojana, Pragati Sansthan, on the basis of caste and population, who were involved in boot lagging and selling intoxicants, carried out a rigors survey in block baran, anta, and mangrol of district Baran. 373 families of different castes; dholi, dome, Sansi, kanjar, nat, rana, babriya, sikliwal, mogya, etc, from 45 villages of these three blocks, who were involved in manufacturing and selling illegal liquor, hemp, cannabis, etc were identified. Latter members of these identified families, those who were interested, were provided skills training and connected with the mainstream of society. Some awareness activities through puppet shows, nukkad Natak, group meetings were also organized in the project area.

Similar to this, in year 2013–14, Pragati Sansthan, for the same purpose, identified around 350 families from the same population and area. Later they were also provided skills training and connected with employment.







Youth Development Programme:

Pragati Sansthan in collaboration with Nehru Youth Kendra, Baran organizes youth-oriented programmes. These programmes attempt to streamline the distracted youth of today and tries to acknowledge them with their true potential. The youth of any nation is the most crucial assent for the growth and development of that nation. Hence, keeping them disciplined and motivated is the responsibility of the entire nation.

Since March 2014 the organisation with the help of Nehru Youth Kendra organises a District Youth Conference every year. The aim of this event is to motivate the youth to do good deeds and the start youth performers are even awarded in this event. From time to time, events are organised on a Block level to motivate and guide the youth.

Similar to this, Pragati Sansthan to identify the talented youth of the district and motivate them, also organized a cultural programme in the Baran district. In these culture programme artist and artisans of different arts like a musician, folk dancers, painters, clay pot, brass item, weaving, etc are participated every year and show their talent and performance. On the basis of their performance, our organization honoured and awarded them.

FAMILY WELFARE
PROGRAMME



Family Welfare Campaign:

Unsustainable population growth puts pressure on human communities, exacerbating food and water shortages, reducing resilience in the face of climate change, and making it harder for the most vulnerable communities to rise out of intergenerational poverty.

To address the problems of population growth and to motivate people for population control through contraceptive uses, Pragati Sansthan with the support of the department of medical and health, Baran conducted the 'Population Control Campaign' in all the blocks of the district Baran. In this campaign, Nukkad Natal & Group Meeting were organized in various villages. Information was disseminated about the problem of population growth, benefits of small family & two child norms, and various methods of population control including temporary methods; condom, oral pills, copper–T, injectables, safe periods, withdrawal methods as well as permanent methods; female sterilization and male sterilization.

Following benefits of small family and contraceptives were described in Nukkad Natak and meetings:

- 1. Women Empowerment Women who can control the number and timing of their children can take better advantage of educational and economic opportunities, improving their own future and that of their families.
- 2.Promotion of social and economic development and security High population growth hampers poor countries' economic development as their expanding populations compete for limited resources such as food, housing, schools, and jobs. Rapid and unsustainable population growth renders societies more unstable and can lead to greater civil unrest.
- 3.Environment protection Since so many women worldwide want fewer children than their mothers did, increasing their access to voluntary family planning services will further slow population growth rates. A rapidly growing population exacerbates environmental degradation and strains the world's resources.
- 4.Improve maternal health and child survival Contraceptives helping women avoid becoming pregnant too early, too late, or too often benefits themselves and their children. Meeting the unmet need for contraceptives reduces maternal mortality rate, infant mortality, and child mortality.
- 5.Reduce the number of abortions overall, especially unsafe abortions which lead to maternal deaths and injuries.
- 6.Prevent sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including HIV/AIDS Improved access to condoms, both male and female, reduces the rate at which STIs, including HIV, are spread. Moreover, to the extent that HIV-positive women are better able to prevent unplanned pregnancies and births, they are also helping to reduce the rate of new HIV infections.

Drug De-addiction Center



De Addiction Programme:

It has been constantly observed that the current generation is into a lot of substance abuse which might not only hamper their future but the future of the entire nation per se. The youth of any nation is the future of the country and if they get into substance abuse then it will ruin their capacity to think about what is right and what is wrong.

In this regard, Pragati Sansthan from time to time works for Drug and alcohol Deaddiction especially for the youth of district Baran. Since 26 June 2014, the organization is working in this field with the help of various departments it has helped several people. To curb this problem the organization attempts to conduct programs and spread awareness about the harms of substance abuse. So far, to create awareness, the organization conducted several workshops, group meetings, rallies, etc at the district, block, and village level. In addition to this other IEC activities like banners and hoardings, wall painting, and slogan writing was also carried out by the organization from time to time.



SCHOOL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE




Training of School Management Committee:

School Management Committee (SMC) has a very crucial role in actualizing the goals of Right To Education. It has tremendous potential to transform the existing system of education, characterized by cynicism and a defeatist outlook of the system functionaries and stakeholders, including teachers and parents. Under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Pragati Sansthan conducted training of school management committee with the support of the District Education Department. This SMC training was conducted in 154 schools of block Kishanganj of district Baran and important information regarding how to run SMC efficiently and effectively was delivered to members of the SMCs. In the training, various topics like criteria for selection of SMC members, Role of members; duties and rights of members, etc were explained by the resource persons. The following function of SMC also described in detail by resource persons:

- 1. Making School Development Plan (SDP) as per the RTE guidelines/norms
- 2. Management of the school
- 3. Supervising and supporting the implementation of SDP
- 4. Supervision/monitoring of finance, management, academic progress, distribution of entitlements & other functions
- 5. Ensuring accountability and transparency in the system through the social audit mechanism
- 6. Keeping proper accounts of the fund available and sharing its deployment and utilization with the 'Grama Sabha'
- 7.Creating and maintaining an educational database
- 8. Coordinating with the local authority, generating funds from other sources for the development of schools
- 9. Monitoring academic progress of the children
- 10. Instituting social audit mechanism and processes to bring transparency in the system and ensure universal participates conducted in the district Baran.

SawarnJayanti Gramin Sawrojgar Yojna (SGSRY) & Sawarn Jayanti Shari Rozgar Yojna (SJSRY)



SawarnJayanti Gramin Sawrojgar Yojna (SGSRY)

NYM joined hand with the ambitious program of government SawarnJayanti Gramin Sawrojgar Yojna to improve the economic condition of villagers by making them self-reliant. SGSRY program is running supported by Zila Parishad, Baran since 2010. 230 women self-help groups have been formed in Baran block. Out of 80 SHGs have reached up to first grading, and 32 SHGs have been shortlisted for startup self-employment activities. According to the choice, practice & feasibility of occupation group members were linked trained professionally for animal husbandry and goat rearing to get maximum outputs. These groups have started milk production, which does not even help them to improve the economic condition of families but also helps for small savings. With seeing this positive responses process have been initiated to form cooperative of SHGs engaging in milk production.

Sawarn Jayanti Shari Rozgar Yojna (SJSRY)

NYM joined hand with the ambitious program of government Sawarn Jayanti Shari Rozgar Yojna to improve the economic condition of villagers by making them self-reliant. SJSRY program is running supported by Municipal Council, Baran since 2013. NYM has awarded work for the formation of 40 SHGs. Till then, 20 women self-help groups have been formed in Baran block. Account has opened for all 20 SHGs and Out of 2 SHGs have reached up to first grading.

Skill enhancement training programmes

Agricultural development

Newer technologies: Agriculture and allied activities are the foremost occupations for livelihood in backward regions like Baran. In order that NYM is conducting structure and on-going interfacing activities to enhance the knowledge of farmers for newer technologies i.e. seeds, fertilizer, and innovative ways to increase productivity. Five villages i.e. Fatehpur, Samraniya, Nareda, Majrawta and Anjroda have chosen for intensive programs for agricultural development activities. However, program is also outreach at district level.

Case cropping: Farmer have encouraged to decide on case framing side by side of traditional framing like flower cultivation. Those, farmer are residing near to district headquarter Bran town were capacitated by newer technologies to cultivate flower.

Animal husbandry: Animal husbandry is part of farmer in rural areas, but it is treated only for fulfilling daily necessity of family members. Series of meeting, campaigning and training were conducted with farmer to enhancing their understanding for better nurturing of animal for higher milk production. Farmers were also getting introduced about hybrid form of cow & buffaloes.

Agricultural Technological Management Agency (ATMA) Prgramme

NYM is initiating activities to promote livelihood supported by Agricultural Technological Management Agency (ATMA), department of agriculture, Baran. Women farmer have targeted under ATMA programme for enhancing their knowledge on farming. Because, women is playing key role in family based activities for framing. Various innovative efforts are executing for strengthening women farmer, following are: □ Exposure visit have organized for 30 women at district level on high technologies for farming especially horticulture. □ Two days exposure cum training programme was organized at Baran district for 30 selected women farmer dated 18-19 March, 2011. Expert from agriculture, animal husbandry, horticulture and social empowerment were delivered training to women farmer for opting newer technologies for increasing family earning.

Skill enhancement training programmes



NYM is formed and developed by youth, so that, youth remain is a central point for their all-round development. Various programs i.e. skill & technical enhancement training program is conducted since 2017–18 supported by Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangthan (NYKS) and other government departments, corporation,s and agencies.

Educated and semi-literate youth and women were trained to get establish their self-employment in their village and hometown. 130 youth were received skilled training on the above seven trades in 2012. And, 321 youth were received skilled training on various trades conducted by NYM in Baran during 2011 & 2010 years.

Gram Sabha Mobilisation

Gram Sabha is the most powerful foundation of decentralized governance as it ensures that elected representatives are directly and regularly accountable to the people. Recognizing the potential of this institution of direct democracy, NYM has been working towards increased mobilization and participation of people in Gram Sabha meetings. There were various activities organized in targeted GPs of Baran districts of Rajasthan: \square Orientation programs, workshops were organized for the enhancement of the understanding of the stakeholders. \square Rallies, Parham Fairies, and Jagrukta Jhatha were organized to mobilize people to participate in Gram Sabha meetings. \square Advocacy with district and state government for qualitative functioning of Gram Sabha meeting.

Orientation to avail MGNREGS (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Grantee Scheme) To enhance avenue of livelihood for poor villagers, NYM links its program to make a success of MGNERGS in Baran district. NYM played a catalyst role to benefit the poor family to get benefit from MNREGS. Orientation programmes, campaigning are organized & regular handholding for marginalize communities to avail the employment opportunities under MGNREGS. If parent of poor child earn their livelihood in their neighborhood, it is directly positive for child development like a) their migration stop in searching work for livelihood and b) economic viability make them in position to send their child in the school. In 2011, NYM has made nodal agencies for imparting training on MGNREGS in all seven blocks of Baran district by acknowledging its initiatives for promoting livelihood opportunities for marginalized section of society. 680 participants i.e. Ward Panch, Sarpanch, GP level official, selected beneficiaries and active citizen leaders were got training by seven block level programme in the period of 6th January, 2011 to 31st March, 2011. Eminent scholars were engaged as a resources person to deliver training for qualitative outcomes.

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Pre-Election Voter's Gender Awareness Campaign (PEVGAC)



Pre-Election Voter's Gender Awareness Campaign (PEVGAC) Pre-Election Voter Gender Awareness campaign was carried by NYM from December to March 2010 in its operating area of Baran District respectively. PEVGAC conducted with the support of the Society for Participatory Research in Asia (PRIA) and UNFPA. NYM was part of a coalition of more than 300 CSOs those covered about 6500 GPs from all 33 districts of Rajasthan. NYM worked in the network of 8 NGOs in the Baran district. 203 GPs were covered out of 269 from the Baran district. The core issues were to making gender issues i.e. sex selection, child marriage, dowry & violence against women and strengthening marginalize leadership as an agenda in the election of PRIs. Various activities i.e. student rallies, group meetings, training, and voter candidates dialogue have been conducted under PEVAC Pan-Rajasthan based on the innovative mode of communication. Information was disseminated on the importance of voting, PRIs, the role of women in PRIs, and the four key issues i.e. prevention of sex selection, maternal health to stop dowry & domestic violence. Voter-candidate dialogues were organized for Contesting candidates to share their agenda with voters, as also how they would take initiatives to stop gender-related atrocities in their respective constituencies if they won the election.
